Progress here is rarely dramatic, but it is real. Learning continued, and children were given **steady the gift of education** shaped by patience and dedication - **because you remained committed.**





Because You Remained Committed, Roots Took Hold

*Your commitment didn't just maintain what existed — it made it possible to **build something new and lasting**.*



Through the **Agroforestry Tree Currency Program**, families at St. Joseph Parish continue the slow work of **restoring land and securing food for the future**. Trees are planted, cared for, and protected—not for immediate gain, but for what they will become. This work requires trust, time, and effort. Farmers are investing in their land and choosing to build a future where they are - **because you remained committed**.

In a place where medical access is fragile, your commitment made it possible for people with hypertension to be seen regularly, monitored carefully, and treated consistently. Blood pressure was checked. Medication was provided. Follow-up mattered.

Because You Remained Committed, St. Joseph Parish now has reliable Power and Connection



Solar panels provide steady electricity for the church—light for prayer, gatherings, and celebrations no longer dependent on daylight or chance. A **satellite internet connection** at the rectory makes communication dependable, allowing parish leaders to stay connected and respond in a timely way.

These improvements are not simply technical. They **strengthen relationships, support ministry**, and make daily parish life possible.

The parish is lit, connected, and able to move forward with confidence - **because you remained committed.**



Because You Remained Committed, the Daily Life of the Parish Continues with Care and Stability

Administrative support keeps the parish functioning and resources well used. **Food** is shared with families in need, offered simply and with dignity. Routine **maintenance of automobiles and motorcycles** allows parish leaders to reach chapels, visit the sick, and remain present across a wide and challenging landscape.

These are not visible achievements, but acts of faithfulness that sustain the church from the inside out.

Ministry continues—quietly, reliably, and with compassion—**because you remained committed.**
