Your Generosity

Makes NEW Agroforestry* Program Possible

"Trees have become currency used to build healthy farming community ecosystems."



JOIN US in our enthusiasm for this new program that began in a northern region of Haiti in 2010. The Tree Currency Program has proven to help farmers increase their crop yields an average of 40% and household incomes by 50 to 100% ?

THE PROBLEM: Haiti is severely deforested. The lack of tree cover <u>reduces agricultural productivity</u>, <u>raises average</u> <u>temperatures</u> and <u>makes rural areas more susceptible to flooding</u>.

Low agricultural productivity leads many of Haiti's farmers to cut down their trees to produce charcoal to supplement their low incomes. As a result of this activity, the cycle of deforestation and rural poverty continues. **THE SOLUTION:** The Smallholder Farmers Alliance has developed a program that makes trees worth more alive than dead. In this program trees have become a form of currency to improve agriculture. By growing, transplanting, and caring for trees, SFA farmers earn credits which they exchange for...

Last August, SFA agronomists made an initial visit to Côtes-de-Fer to assess the feasibility of this program. In a 25-page report they relayed general conditions of the area and documented "serious problems related to natural resource management and inappropriate agricultural practices being implemented by local farmers."

They recommended the application of the SFA agroforestry program named Tree Currency for a period of 5 consecutive years. This will be <u>followed by a transition of the program to the people</u> <u>of Côtes-de-Fer.</u>

Thanks to your continuous support for our twin parish, we gratefully announce that funds are available to begin year one of the Tree Currency program. Your support for the Fête for Haiti will help us continue this program. Thank You.

There is much to explain about the Tree Currency program. There will be more features on this topic in future issues of Twin Parish News.

*Agroforestry is the intentional integration of trees and shrubs into crop and animal farming systems to create environmental, economic and social benefits.
