A Simple Providence Has Brought Us Together Meet our twin parish pastor, Father Islaire Faustin

Editor's Note: It has been some time since we updated Father Faustin's biography. Please pray for him, as he begins his ninth year at St. Joseph.

We are blessed to have Father Islaire Faustin as "our man on the ground" in Haiti. He is a true humanist who has worked very closely with Helping Hugs since he arrived at St. Joseph parish in 2015.

The youngest of five children, Father Faustin grew up in Maribial, a community in the mountains north of Jacmel. He accompanied his father, a chapel director, as he carried out his director's responsibilities. Father had the desire to become a priest in elementary school. As he matured, he also had the desire of becoming a doctor or lawyer, without giving up the idea of becoming a priest.



Father's goal is to serve neglected and abandoned people. He first studied philosophy in Haiti. Later, he

studied theology in Lille, France. After ordination in December 2006, he studied law in Haiti, where he received his license. He also did a specialization in criminal law in France.

At first Father was apprehensive about his assignment to Côtes-de-Fer. St. Joseph was known to be a difficult parish. (Our former president, Larry Meagher, liked to refer to it as "Siberia" because it is in the westerner-most region of the Jacmel diocese in a very arid, mountainous area.) Father says that it is still a very difficult assignment due its size and many chapels (10). It is a farming area that depends on rain. "Unfortunately, it does not fall often." The population is "very poor" but "very nice" to work with.

During his tenure Father has seen certain changes coming about. Young people are aware of the need for change in the community and are working for its development. There are a lot more young people going to university. One of Father's dreams is to see an income-generating activity in the parish, such as a community store. He would like use the proceeds for charitable activities.

Father is grateful for our twinning relationship. He says, "This is what allows the parish to exist. Without this pairing I don't know what we would do!"
