Emergency Food Rations Received at St. Joseph Parish



Through your generosity, funds were available to take advantage of a matching food grant. You provided \$12,000 worth of food to the people of St. Joseph parish.

The weather, the coronavirus, and political instability have all contributed to food scarcity throughout Haiti. Our twin parish community is no exception. For months we have been hearing from Father Faustin that he receives pleas for food on a daily basis.

Your support for our friends in Haiti provided \$4,000 of food relief in April and June. In July we were offered a matching grant to provide additional food through FOOD FOR THE POOR. We sent a total of \$6,000. Beginning August 20th, \$12,000 worth of food began arriving in Côtes-de-Fer.

Father selected the most vulnerable families in the 10 chapel areas and in Côtes-de-Fer to receive food kits. The nonperishable food being provided is: rice, cornmeal, beans, sardines, oil and canned milk.

Thank you for making this food distribution possible.



August 19th, the first truck arrives.

It was a long two days of food deliveries.









August 20th, the second much larger truck finally departs at 11:55 PM.

Haiti Suffers Devastation Of Tropical Storm Laura



August 23, 2020

Just as Father Faustin was preparing to deliver food kits throughout his parish, tropical storm, Laura, arrived. The high winds and floodwaters left devastation everywhere.

The day after the storm passed the island, Father did site visits to see the damage caused by the storm. He reported, "The toll is heavy. We recorded a lot of damage. All roads are damaged."

There were no human deaths in Cô*tes-de-Fer,* "but goats are swept away by the ravines and the plantations are destroyed."

When asked if he ever tired of the troubles in Haiti, Father said, "I keep morale high. I accept the situation as it is. I am not complaining. God is with us. He is in control of events."

"I am awaiting the meeting with the chapel directors next Saturday for more information concerning the damage caused by storm Laura."

August 30, 2020

Father found the meeting with the chapel directors to be very interesting. They reported that all of the villages have been "affected by the storm. Lots of dead cattle, impassable roads and devastated gardens."

Please pray for everyone in Haiti who has suffered the devastation of tropical storm, Laura.
